

IoT-BASED WATER QUALITY INDICATOR

Ms. Anjali Ananthan, AP ECE presented a paper on IoT Based Water Quality Indicator for the International Conference On Emerging Technologies (ICET 2022) organized by Royal CET Akkikavu Thrissur on 16-17 September 2022.

Living things require water to survive, so it is a vital resource. Numerous fresh water sources have been contaminated by industries and other factors. People move from villages to cities in search of better amenities and a higher standard of living. Because of this, there is a concentration of people in one area, but the fresh water sources cannot supply enough fresh water for such a large population. Since the government cannot provide for everyone's needs, they delegate the task to others. A key method for supplying water to cities is the water tanker. However, it is unknown where the water is being taken from and what quality of water is being supplied in these tankers. Use of impure water obtained from such to prevent such problems, analyse the quality of drinking water unidentified sources has been linked to a number of diseases. A water quality indicator system is being implemented in this paper, and provide real-time data

The system in place uses a number of sensors, a Node MCU, and an Arduino microcontroller to test the water's quality and send the results to the appropriate authorities.


